9. **MOTION (HON. JEREMIAH SANG – MCA KAMAGUT WARD)**

Aware that the County Budget Implementation Review Report (CBIRR) is regularly prepared in fulfillment of Article 228 of the Constitution of Kenya, 2010 which requires the office of the Controller of Budget (OCDB) to oversee and report on the implementation of the budgets of both National and County Governments so that citizens get services on timely basis; **Further Aware that** based on the County Government Budget Implementation Review Report for the First Quarter for FY 2015/2016 released by the Office of the Controller of Budget (OCOB) Uasin Gishu was amongst counties with least absorption rate of its development budget rated at 0.2%; **Noting that** the Controller of Budget cited that this situation was amongst other things, occasioned by inadequate human capacity to use E-Procurement system to procure of goods and services thus resulting in the low absorption of development expenditure; **Concerned that** if this issue is not addressed the public might be denied essential services that are core to the economic development of the county; **Deeply concerned that** as we grapple with lack of medicine in our hospitals and dispensaries our road making equipment are stalled due to lack of fuel all resulting from procurement hitches; **Cognizant that** the County has lost almost 3 months of service delivery, time and risks losing more, at the peril of county residents; This County Assembly urges the County Government of Uasin Gishu through the department of ICT and E- Government to liaise with the National Treasury's Integrated Financial Management Information System(IFMIS) department in building capacity of the relevant staff County on E- Procurement and IFMIS in order to remedy this situation as a matter of urgency.
